

## **SPECIAL EDUCATION**

### **Participation in State and District-wide Assessments**

- A. In the case of a district-wide assessment, David City Public Schools shall develop guidelines for the provision of appropriate accommodations and modifications.
- B. In the case of a district-wide assessment, the school district shall develop and implement guidelines for the participation of children with disabilities in alternate assessments for those children who cannot participate in regular assessments with accommodations or modifications as indicated in their respective individualized education programs. The guidelines shall provide for alternate assessments that:
  - 1. Are aligned with the Nebraska Department of Education's challenging academic content standards and challenging student academic achievement standards; and
  - 2. If the Nebraska Department of Education has adopted alternate academic achievement standards permitted under the regulations promulgated to carry out the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, measure the achievement of children with disabilities against those standards.
- C. David City Public Schools will make available to the public, and report to the public with the same frequency and in the same detail as they report on the assessment of nondisabled children, the following:
  - 1. The number of children with disabilities participating in regular assessments and the number of those children who were provided accommodations in order to participate in those assessments.
  - 2. The number of children with disabilities participating in alternate assessments.
  - 3. The performance results of children with disabilities on regular assessments and on alternate assessments if the number of children with disabilities participating is sufficient to yield statistically reliable information and reporting that information will not reveal personally identifiable information about an individual student, compared with the achievement of all children, including children with disabilities on those assessments.
